

Prescott Weekend Update



January 28th, 2024

Good Afternoon PLC Families:

You'll recall, over the past couple of Weekend Memos I have shared the effects and impacts of poor attendance/being consistently late for class and the importance of sleep in improving achievement and attendance. This week I'd like to share specific strategies between home and school to improve attendance and limit tardies. A couple of things before I begin: one, much of what you are about to read was derived from a great school district website from Guelph Ontario, the Upper Grand District School Board; and two, a result of these recent memos we have seen a marked increase of families like yourself contacting the school for support regarding attendance and lates: good. That was exactly the point. Thank you for reaching out to us.

I share this because if you have a child who is struggling to get to school on time, or even at all, I need to assure you that you are not alone. Raising children is one of the most rewarding yet challenging responsibilities that we all have in common. Rarely is the path without problems or pitfalls. Your child's struggles are not a reflection of your parenting skills. And remember, we have children too. We know how hard it is, there's no judgement.

If your child is struggling with attendance, the best advice is to never give up on the expectation to attend school. Even if your child has anxiety, rather than working around the issue, it is important to deal with the anxiety directly. Ask why they don't want to attend school, ask questions about what is worrying them, and encourage them to talk about their

anxiety. As the key adults in their lives we are often so concerned for their well being that we make assumptions as to why they don't want to attend school. We need to keep an open mind and validate their concerns. What may seem 'minor' or even 'silly' to us is a big deal for a kid: certainly, big enough to keep them from attending school. Often reluctant attenders don't have a sense of belonging. To help create a connection with the school community, encourage your child to get involved in a school extracurricular activity or participate in our monthly Puma Pride Dress up days/events (last week's beach day was a hit!) As well, consider offering a desired activity, trip or special treat if your child reaches a pre-set attendance goal. If their reason for not attending is an issue at school, reach out to us and share what you have learned. We will do our best to address these concerns and provide your child with a safe place when the causes of anxiety pop up at school. As I mentioned last week, sleep routines and schedules are vital in addressing attendance issues. As difficult as this may be, it is critical that screen time be removed 30 minutes prior to bedtime. Also consider laying out clothes and packing lunches and backpacks the night before. This will make it easier to get out the door in the morning. And if you get the call during the day that your child wants to leave school early, let the office know. Sometimes, connecting with a caring adult allows for a much-needed break that will enable them to return to class for the remainder of the day.

Finally, if your child refuses to attend, it is important to make staying home as boring as possible. Consider removing all screens during the day including video games. I have had parents go so far as shutting down the internet during the day or taking the power cord to the XBox or Playstation to work with them. Keep in mind that attendance and lates can escalate quickly making it critical to reach out early. We can support you in ways that you may not be familiar with. Before staying home becomes a habit, make the call or send the email, it is always far more productive when we work together to solve the problem. With

this in mind, and with Teachers Convention on the horizon the week after next, here's what is happening at PLC this for the next couple of weeks.

Previously Shared Information

AP 750 Severe Weather Supporting Student Learning - With all of the recent bus cancellations, I would like to draw your attention to a recent change to PSD Administration Policy 750. Prior to COVID, teachers were not permitted to introduce new lessons while students were unable to access buses. However, as the pandemic taught us, being away from school isn't the same barrier to learning as it was in the past. The policy states that "[t]eachers shall endeavour to balance the learning-outcome requirements of students who have arrived at school with the learning-outcome requirements of students who are remaining at home". Section 11.1 states that even when buses are canceled "[t]eachers may distribute new or ongoing learning tasks through familiar online platforms (Google Classroom, Class Dojo, etc.) and/or monitor and support learning tasks already in process." meaning if they are able students can continue with virtual learning when the buses don't run.
